With regard to support from the NIH in Bytux Institute, I am in favor of requesting it because it gives greater flexibility to the investigator. I have not done anything yet with regard to my Grant; therefore the doors are still open to introduce adequate modifications.

The meeting in Paris was quite interesting. I had a chance to discuss many problems with Monod's group, Rosenberg, Wilbrandt and other people connected with transport. I will be visiting Pollock's lab next week.
