Dear Josh, I have now
received the phages and strains
from Bulgakov, they look
all right but I have not tried
them as I leave for Dallas etc
tomorrow or day after. I gather
you have a set on the way also,
so I will leave mine at NYU
for the time being.

I have not laid my hands on
a *Styphi* strain of Group A yet,
but hope to do so. I have been
to see Saphira Seligman & Wasserman

but they had none: I have asked
them to send me some other strains
which are I thought might be
interesting, such as the one that
showed (non-agglut i + 123)
(agglut i + 123), i, 123 and 0
phases. I find you had already
asked for the lactose + Subonella.
I have also asked Leipson at
Loyola, Chicago for his *S. wicklita*
strain, and for the non-motile
flagellated *S. typhimurium* (see
current J. Path. & Bact.) I have
asked for these strains to be
addressed to me care of you at
Madison, so if any packages looking
like strains arrive, perhaps you
would be kind enough to have
them opened & the strains preserved.
I hope to see Edwards at C.D. Atlanta
on the way to Dallas, & will try & get
anything interesting apropos flagella
from there also.

On re-reading Bulgakov's papers his work sounds good. I think the phase should give us some interesting results.

I am in the midst of a mess of packing, giving up my apt., clearing out lab & fig. at NYU etc, but expect to have a good time on the trip. My regards to Walter 2. and to Esther.

I will let you know when I expect to reach Madison later on, your suggestions about making it a base for visits around seems a very good one to me.
