Thank you very much for your letter of October 11, Your additional suggestions, and the print of Freud's article. I do not recall having read just this article, but the argument undoubtedly appears elsewhere in his works and his reasoning did appear quite familiar to me. I am, however, pleased to have this explicit reference. It is curious that I was quoting the narcissistic impulse as one of the pressures that might hasten the adoption of new biological techniques, while that same impulse can, as Freud suggested, impede a rational discussion of their utility and other implicatons.

The whole matter doubtless warrants much more discussion, but I am glad to say that the evening session did help me to crystallize a perspective on the sources of the reaction I have all too frequently observed to these innovations.

I am enclosing a few relevant writings of my own that you might wish either for your personal file or for the Institute library, or to be discarded, as you see fit.
