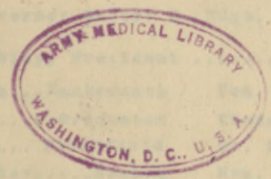

FOREWORD

There are in New Jersey a number of incorporated homes for the aged to which men and women of advanced years may be admitted in accordance with certain conditions. Some of the homes are for members of fraternal organizations, some for members of certain creeds, and some with limitations as to residence, race, and color.

An entrance fee is required for most of the homes, although some are entirely free and some fix the fee according to the financial circumstances of the applicant. The majority of the homes are the beneficiaries of all money and property belonging to the estates of persons dying in the homes. There is no uniform policy as to burials and burial expenses.

A good physical condition is necessary for admission to nearly all of the homes. Exceptions in this policy are noted in the descriptions given in the directory.

The homes for the aged included in this directory are incorporated under Title 15, Chapter 1, Revised Statutes of 1937, as amended, and are controlled by their own boards which are responsible for the administration and financing of the homes.

The first section of the directory lists, by municipalities in alphabetic order, incorporated homes for the aged together with their capacities, fees, and limitations, as to sex, age, color, race, residence, church, or fraternal affiliations, that agencies and individuals may know what homes are available for any aged persons who need institutional care. These homes have been approved by the State Department of Institutions and Agencies after inspection by field representatives.

In the second and third sections of the directory will be found the county and municipal welfare houses or almshouses in the State. The counties, through their welfare houses, are attempting to give hospital care to the chronically ill and to provide homes for the dependent and aged who cannot live in homes of their own or in homes of rela-

tives. Old Age Assistance makes it possible for many of the aged who meet the Federal and State requirements, to live in their own homes or with relatives or in boarding homes.

The Poor Law permits the establishment of modern welfare houses by counties or groups of counties, which seek to provide a real home for indigents and for persons who can contribute toward their own support, to give adequate hospital care to their residents who are temporarily or chronically-ill, and to plan their institutional program in such a way that each resident will have the care that will benefit him physically and the living conditions that will best meet his social needs.
