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Dear Francis.

Received your note several hours ago. About the Discovery article - D.K. concerning the Scientific American. I do not want to write another article on DNA. Why not a joint article by Maurice and yourself. I believe Maurice should get as much credit as possible. The pay is \$200 per article. I'm still opposed to the BRC.

I was in Berkeley for a week. Very pleasant and stimulating. Especially Calvin!!! The most inventive mind I've seen since returning to the states. He suggests an alternate way to pair Adenine with Thymine [enol] ~~with~~ and Guanine [keto] with Cytosine. I'm not too happy about it but it is worth looking into. Spent much of my visit talking about RNA. Robley Williams has E.M. photographs which appear to indicate that it looks identical with DNA. (However he has not yet ruled out possibility that he is looking at DNA contamination). If really true, very exciting. I obtained some new TMV RNA from Knight which looks quite encouraging. Yesterday to my great surprise I found I could pull out pretty highly birefringent fibres. One of them is now in front of an X-ray beam

and I am keeping my fingers crossed. All of my previous specimens (which gave largely powder pictures) were obtained via the Bernal cover glass technique. I am thus in an optimistic mood - Have done little work models recently - largely because of a desire to know the equatorial spacings.

My situation with regard to the Staff has been quite depressing as of late. Upon my return from Berkeley I found the Appeal Board had turned me down unanimously and today an induction notice for January 11th arrived. Caltech, however, is fighting for me rather hard, and by calling Washington this morning we were able to postpone my induction until the case is reviewed at still higher levels.

I am flying to Chicago on Wednesday for Christmas. I shall probably continue onto to

the East Coast. Am tentatively scheduled to meet Auertler in New York or Boston. I should also like to look over Bethesda. I would probably arrive on the 28th or 29th, and leave the East Coast a week later. Auertler I might meet at your place if this is convenient. I should like to talk over RNA with you. There is no one here with whom I can profitably talk with as none here believes himself capable of the Pauling type approach to structures. - Crystallographers are basically dead. Pauling is now gone and will be so for 4 months - India - Japan. I would have written sooner but my draft situation has been so desperate as to preclude any plan making.

Am sorry to learn that Odile and Gabrielle may return to England. Is Brooklyn that ghostly. She should be persuaded to stay - give her the indulgence of summer in Cold Spring Harbor - very cheap and pleasant no matter what temperature. Definitely not a hell hole. Very few if any derogative young men but splendid swimming, canoeing, clamming, etc. I

I am beginning to tolerate Pasadena. Very little snow as of late and I have ^{not} someone I can talk to.
