




**DOSIMETRIC GRANULES.**

There is much to be said in favor of administering the isolated active principles of drugs instead of the more bulky and less palatable forms, such as tinctures, extracts, powders, etc. In many cases, and particularly where it has been shown that the activity of a drug is due to the presence of a definite chemical compound, the results are much more prompt and satisfactory, and are obtained with a certainty that has won for this system the name, "Positive Medication." The fact that there are many drugs whose medicinal effects cannot be traced to any proximate principle does not in the least affect the rationale of administering true active principles, and this is all that is claimed for positive medication by its advocates. The alkaloïds and other organic drugs used in the preparation of the following named granules are of the best grades obtainable in the markets. In addition to the organic drugs we have included in the following list some of the more active inorganic remedial agents.



## NOTES OF REFERENCE.

**1. Acid Phosphates, Liquid.** Each fluidounce contains: Calcium phosphate, 3 grs.; Magnesium phosphate, 1-2 gr.; Potassium phosphate, 1-4 gr.; Iron phosphate, 1-2 gr.; Syrupy Phosphoric acid, 6 3-8 minims. Dose, 1-2 to 1 teaspoonful in sweetened water. The stimulating properties of this preparation have long been known to physicians, and it has been extensively prescribed in various nervous disorders, including insomnia, melancholia, and nervous exhaustion. For price see page 186.

**2. Aconitine, crystalline.** In view of the fact that a number of preparations from aconite are sold as aconitine, and as there is a great variation in strength, we desire to call attention to the fact that we employ only the best grade of crystallized aconitine in our preparations. The crystalline alkaloids of aconite are extremely sensitive and are apt to become converted into the amorphous alkaloids which are in no way comparable to them as regards activity, being in fact considered inert by many authorities. The crystalline alkaloid when pure will be easily detected by the physiological test when dissolved in from 100,000 to 200,000 parts of water, and is therefore from two hundred to four hundred times as strong as the root.

**3. Adhatoda Vasica,** Malabar nut. An Indian plant which is alleged to possess a powerful bactericidal influence, but to be non-toxic to the higher forms of animal life. It is said to contain an alkaloid, vasicine, but has not been studied to any extent and consequently very little is known of its real value as a medicinal agent. For price of fluid extract see page 4.

**4. Adonis vernalis.** One of the Ranunculaceæ native to Northern Europe and Asia, which is being widely recognized as a cardiac tonic. It contains a glucoside, adonidin, to which its activity is usually ascribed. The drug resembles digitalis in action, but is considered more prompt and possesses the further advantage of having no cumulative effect. It is usually exhibited as fluid extract. For price see page 4.

**5. Alterative Compound.** The combination of vegetable alteratives, known under a variety of names such as McDade's Prescription, Bamboo-brier Compound, Creek Indian

Remedy, etc., and prepared from the formula of Drs. G. W. McDade and J. Marion Sims. It has been employed with considerable success in the treatment of primary and secondary syphilis. For price see page 5. We also direct attention to our Fl. Ext. Trifolium Compound (page 46), and Syr. Trifolium Compound (page 175), as especially valuable alterative combinations.

**6. Antiseptic Tablets, Seiler's.** Each tablet contains Sodium bicarbonate, Sodium borate, of each 3 3-4 grs.; Sodium benzoate, Sodium salicylate, of each 5-32 gr.; Eucalyptol, Thymol, of each 5-64 gr.; Menthol and Oil of Wintergreen, of each about 1-24 gr.; and is intended to be dissolved in two ounces of water. A solution of this strength has been found very beneficial in nasal catarrh, being sufficiently alkaline to dissolve the thickened secretions adhering to the nasal mucous membrane, and, by its antiseptic properties, destroying the odor and bringing about a healthy condition of the passages. **7. Arnica.** We list fluid extracts of both the root and the flowers; the former is the official preparation, but as the latter is the one in most common use, we invariably supply the fluid extract of the flowers when fluid extract of arnica is ordered without further specification. See page 6.

**8. Bamboo-brier.** The rhizome of this plant which grows abundantly in southeastern United States is well known as an alterative and tonic, and is thought by many physicians to be superior in these respects to the sarsaparillas obtained from Central and South America. For price of fluid extract see page 7. See also note No. 5 on Alterative Compound, sometimes known as Bamboo-brier Compound.

**9. Bay Laurel, Concentrated.** We were the first to offer to the trade a concentrated fluid Bay Laurel for the extemporaneous preparation of Bay Rum. We have consistently maintained the quality of our product, and feel that we are justified in the claim that our concentrated Bay Laurel is unequalled by any other similar preparation now on the market. The addition of one and one-half fluidounces to one gallon of dilute alcohol produces a Bay Rum fully equal to the imported article, and at a much smaller cost, and, if this be again diluted one-half, the re-

sulting product will still be superior to that usually supplied to barbers. When prepared according to directions given on the label, the Bay Rum is ready to dispense immediately, no filtration being required. For price see page 7.

**10. Beef, Preparations of.** Most liquid preparations of beef, such as Beef, Iron and Wine, and its various combinations, are prepared from the ordinary commercial extract of beef. The popular impression that beef extract is highly nutritious and fully represents the beef from which it is made is wholly fallacious and is repudiated by the best authorities. Beef extract consists of the soluble salts and flavoring matters of beef and these are slightly stimulating but not nutritious. The nutritious portion of beef is its proteid matter, which is for the most part insoluble and consequently is almost entirely lacking in commercial beef extracts; therefore, while these latter may have an agreeable flavor, though even this is not often the case, their properties are only those of a condiment.

The preparations of beef which we offer differ from others of similar name because ours have nutritive properties and are *true foods*. Instead of using beef extract, which is worthless, we employ *beef peptone* which is made by peptonizing choice selected lean beef, thus obtaining its proteid, nutritious matter, including fibrin, in a soluble and acceptable form. Our preparations, therefore, have not only the agreeable flavor of beef but its nutritive properties as well. This point is well worthy the attention of both physicians and pharmacists who wish to supply a reliable and satisfactory preparation. For prices see page 177.

**11. Berberis Aquifolium.** This drug has become known as a valuable tonic and alterative and occupies a very important place in modern materia medica. Its principal active constituent is berberine, which is the yellow alkaloid occurring in hydrastis and numerous other drugs. Our fluid extract is assayed and warranted to contain not less than 3.25 per cent. berberine, and should therefore be given the preference over preparations which are not standardized, as the yield of alkaloid in *Berberis Aquifolium* often runs as low as one per cent. Obviously a fluid extract prepared from such a sample would have to be given in doses three times as large

as ours in order to produce the same effect, and would therefore be about three times as expensive, in addition to the disadvantage of its larger dose. For price see page 8.

**12. Blackberry Aromatic.** A reliable and satisfactory product for the extemporaneous preparation of Aromatic Syrup (or Elixir) of Blackberry, of unusual quality. The demand for a mild, pleasant and effective astringent and carminative for the treatment of summer complaints, such as colic, diarrhea and dysentery is well met by this combination. For price see page 9.

**13. Black Cohosh Compound.** This compound fluid affords a convenient means for the extemporaneous preparation of Compound Syrup (or Elixir) of Cimicifuga. The combination is a valuable one, having sedative, expectorant and antispasmodic properties. Although it is used chiefly as an expectorant, it has been found valuable in the treatment of uterine colic, locomotor ataxia, and in short, as a general antispasmodic. For price see page 9.

**14. Black Willow.** The bark of this tree contains about fifty per cent. more salicin and about twenty-five per cent. less tannin than that of the white willow. It is, therefore, more decidedly antiperiodic, and somewhat less astringent than white willow bark. Both bark and buds of black willow are considered useful in spermatorrhea and various forms of uterine and ovarian neuralgia, and recently they have come into favor as anaphrodisiacs. **15. Blood-flower.** Astringent, styptic, and anthelmintic. It has also been recommended in gonorrhoea and vaginal leucorrhoea. For price of fluid extract see page 10.

**16. Boldo.** An evergreen shrub native to Chile, whose leaves possess tonic and diuretic properties. It is considered of value in hepatitis and chronic torpor of the liver. In South America it has a considerable reputation in the treatment of gonorrhoea and cystitis. For price of fluid extract see page 10.

**17. Broom-corn seed.** A demulcent diuretic and sedative, which exerts a peculiarly soothing influence over the genito-urinary tract, in inflamed conditions. It is entirely dif-

ferent from broom-top, *Cytisus Scoparius*, and should not be confounded with it. For price of fluid extract see page 11.

**18. Buchu.** Although both the long and short buchu are official and may be used without discrimination, it is the general belief that the latter is of greater therapeutic value than the other, and we accordingly supply fluid extract of short buchu unless the other variety is especially requested. See page 11.

**19. Buchu, Compound Preparations of.** We offer five different compound fluid extracts of buchu, intended for the extemporaneous preparation of compound elixirs, one of which is that of the N. F. These are combinations of well-known diuretics and antilithics, and will be found valuable in the treatment of diseases of the kidneys and bladder, inflammation of the genito-urinary tract, etc.

The preparations are: Buchu Comp. for Stearns' Elixir; Buchu Comp. for N. F. Elixir; Buchu, Juniper and Potassium acetate for Elixir; Buchu and Pareira Brava, for Elixir; and Buchu and Pareira Comp. for Elixir. For prices see page 11.

**20. Caffeine citrate** is a chemical possibility, but is difficult to prepare and is easily decomposed. In the presence of water it splits up into caffeine and citric acid, therefore it cannot be formed by mixing aqueous solutions of the acid and the alkaloid, as was formerly supposed. The Pharmacopœia recognizes this fact, and adopts the title Citrated Caffeine for a mixture of equal parts of caffeine and citric acid, which is to be dispensed whenever "caffeine citrate" is specified. Wherever the term Citrated Caffeine is used in this catalogue the U. S. P. product is the one referred to.

**21. California Laurel.** This is a California shrub whose leaves are said to be efficacious in nervous headaches, intestinal colic, and atonic diarrhea. The fluid extract is considered the best form for administration and the dose ranges from ten to thirty minims. For price see page 13.

**22. Caroba.** In Brazil, the habitat of this small tree, several species of the genus *Jacaranda* are known as caroba, carobo, etc. We employ *Jacaranda procera* in the preparation of our fluid extract. Caroba is extensively employed in Brazil as an alterative and antisiphilitic, and is also considered diuretic and diaphoretic. For price see page 14.

**23. Cascara Amarga.** This drug, native to Mexico and Honduras, is an alterative which is coming into favor in the treatment of many diseases of syphilitic origin, particularly syphilitic eruptions, gummatous tumors, chronic eczema, etc. For price of fluid extract see page 14.

**24. Cascara Sagrada.** According to Prof. J. U. Lloyd, in a paper read before the A. Ph. A. in 1896, the credit for introducing Cascara Sagrada to the medical profession is due to Dr. J. H. Bundy, of Calusa, Cal., in 1877. Although the drug was received with somewhat doubtful favor at first, its value has been so thoroughly demonstrated that it occupies a place in modern materia medica among the most important drugs. Inasmuch as it did not become very popular with the medical profession before a palatable fluid extract was placed on the market, and as we were the originators of the first and only fluid extract of it which is not bitter and does not gripe, we feel that much of its success as a remedial agent is due to our own efforts. We publish several pamphlets on this important drug which we shall be pleased to send to any physician or pharmacist on request. In addition to the preparations hereafter mentioned, we make the ordinary bitter fluid extract for those who for any reason may prefer it to the more palatable preparations. Our cascara bark is aged by storing it fully two years before using, by which means the griping property is considerably lessened. We wish to reiterate that cascara should be used only as a tonic laxative, and when in the treatment of chronic constipation cathartic effects are desired, some more active purgative should be employed, followed by small doses of cascara. See page 14.

**Kasagra.** This is a preparation of which we are justly proud. Its success has been almost phenomenal from its very introduction, and each year its sale has been largely increased. This could not have happened if it were not all we claim, for we have not expended much money in advertising it. For several years we listed this preparation under the name of Cascara Aromatic, but several other manufacturers, seeing the remarkable success it was achieving, adopted the same and similar titles for preparations of their own, which were not the same as ours, and none of which is of full fluid extract

strength. In this way they did injustice to the medical profession and to us, and we do not believe that they have profited greatly by such a course. Therefore, in order that the medical profession, as well as ourselves, may be protected when they prescribe our preparation, we have adopted for it the name *KASAGRA*, which is a fanciful word coined by us to mean *Cascara Aromatic-Stearns'*. Prof. John Uri Lloyd, in a recent letter to us, said:

"To Frederick Stearns & Co., of Detroit, Mich. (1889), is due the credit of producing and bringing before the medical and pharmaceutical professions the first palatable fluid extract (*Cascara Aromatic*) of *Cascara Sagrada*. I consider this introduction so marked that out of credit to that house I refused to make a *Cascara Aromatic*, and when the house of Lloyd Bros. has orders for it, leaving the selection to us, the preparation of Frederick Stearns & Co. is invariably supplied, for to *us* the name of "*Cascara Aromatic*" means *their* preparation. When the history of the preparations of this drug is written, I believe full credit must be given to Frederick Stearns & Co. for that conspicuous discovery." For price see page 195.

**25. *Cascara Improved.*** The regular fluid extract of *cascara* is precipitated by the addition of water, and as it is frequently prescribed in combination with aqueous liquids an unsightly mixture is the result. To obviate this difficulty, which is one of pharmaceutical importance only, we have prepared *Cascara Sagrada, Improved*, which differs from the regular chiefly in being soluble in aqueous liquids. It is somewhat more agreeable to the taste than the regular fluid extract, but less so than *Kasagra*. For price see page 14.

**26. *Cedron.*** The seeds of *Simaba Cedron*, a tree growing in Central and South America, have a considerable reputation there as a remedy for the bites of snakes, poisonous insects, etc. Whether or not this reputation is deserved is as yet undecided, but the drug appears to possess valuable tonic, antiperiodic and antispasmodic properties. It is also a griping purgative if given in excessively large doses. For price of fluid extract see page 15.

**27. *Cereus grandiflorus.*** Inasmuch as clinical experience has shown that *Cactus Bonplandii* and *Cactus McDon-*

aldii have therapeutic properties identical with *Cereus* (or *Cactus*) *grandiflorus*, and as the medical profession seem to prefer it, we list only the latter named variety. Sharp and Hoseason did not succeed in finding either alkaloids or glucosides in this plant, although they examined a considerable number of specimens. They established the presence of several resins, however, all soluble in absolute alcohol, to which they are inclined to ascribe such activity as the drug may possess. **28. Chapparro Amargoso.** A reputed antiseptic, astringent and antiperiodic, much esteemed in diarrhea and dysentery. Its activity is supposed to be partly due to a resinous principle known as amargosin. The plant is of South American origin. For price of fluid extract see page 16.

**29. Chekan.** This evergreen shrub is indigenous to Chile; its leaves are considered efficacious in chronic respiratory catarrh, chronic bronchitis, and are also said to possess antiseptic, diuretic and expectorant properties. It is said to contain chekenon, chekenin and chekenetin, which are crystalline bodies; a volatile oil and an amorphous bitter principle. For price of fluid extract see page 16.

**30. Cinchona.** Our fluid extract of cinchona is made to conform to the official requirements, namely, 5% total alkaloids, of which not less than one-half is quinine. For red cinchona our standard is 5% total alkaloids, and for pale cinchona, 3% total alkaloids. We list also Detannated Cinchona, for use in mixtures containing iron salts; also Fluid Cinchona Compound for preparing U. S. P. Tincture, and Liquid Cinchona Compound for preparing B. P. Tincture. Both of these latter contain red cinchona. We offer also Fluid Cinchona Aromatic, which will be found a convenient combination for preparing aromatic wines, elixirs and tinctures of cinchona. **31. Coca.** The properties of coca leaves are by this time so well known as hardly to need any special mention. The drug has been shown to be of remarkable value in conserving energy and retarding tissue waste. It is a useful stimulant to the brain and nervous system in neurasthenia, melancholia, protracted mental depression, etc. Our fluid extract is made

to conform to a standard of .5% cocaine, and is therefore uniform in strength. This is of importance, as there is a wide range of variation in the alkaloidal strength of coca leaves as found in the market, and a fluid extract which is not standardized is an uncertain factor in the treatment of disease. In addition to the regular fluid extract we offer a soluble fluid extract, for the preparation of elixir or wine of coca. For prices see page 18. See also "Cocavin," page 204.

**32. Cocillana.** A Bolivian drug which has been found to possess expectorant properties of considerable value, it being held by some to be fully as efficacious as ipecac in this respect. In large doses it acts as an emetic, producing considerable depression, dull headache, and sneezing. In acute and subacute bronchitis, and bronchial pneumonia, it has been employed with some success. The active principle is thought to be a glucoside, but has not been thoroughly investigated. For price of fluid extract see page 18.

**34. Corn Ergot.** This drug has given fair promise of rivaling ergot as an oxytocic, but as yet its use has not been very extensive. Its contracting action on the uterus is said to be intermittent, differing in that respect from the ordinary (or rye) ergot. It is said also to be useful in eczema and psoriasis. For price of fluid extract see page 19.

**35. Corn-silk.** Though this drug is now officially known as *Zea* we list it as corn-silk, that being the name by which it is almost universally called. It is a mild, stimulant diuretic, which has been found to be quite valuable in acute and chronic cystitis, and in irritation of the bladder due to uric acid and phosphatic gravel. It has also been employed in the treatment of gonorrhoea. For price of fluid extract see page 19.

**36. Coto.** The botanical origin of this Bolivian drug is as yet undetermined. Our fluid extract is made from true coto, instead of false or para-coto, and as para-coto probably is less active, this is an item which should be remembered in prescribing and dispensing. Coto is an intestinal antiseptic and astringent and is highly recommended in diarrhoeas of various forms particularly those of phthisis, typhoid fever and cholera. It is also said to be useful in rheumatism. For price of fluid extract see page 19.

**37. Damiana.** This drug, which was introduced as a powerful aphrodisiac, has not fulfilled the expectations of the medical profession, but has nevertheless been found to be of some value in atonic impotence. It probably acts principally as a bitter tonic. For price of fluid extract see page 20.

**38. Damiana Compound.** This preparation, the formula for which is given in the fluid extract list (page 20), will be found a valuable tonic to the sexual organs. It is a cerebrospinal stimulant and is extensively used in the treatment of impotence due to atony.

**39. Diastase-Stearns.** Diastase-Stearns is the name we have given to our brand of pancreatic diastase to distinguish it from other brands of diastase on the market. We take great pains in its preparation, having established a laboratory in Chicago, where we obtain a large supply of fresh pancreas. Being at this great central market gives us opportunities that cannot be obtained by those who are obliged to ship their crude material for long distances. Our laboratory facilities are all modern, and, we believe, turn out a finer product than any other manufacturing establishment in the same line. That this is not a mere assertion can be easily demonstrated by comparing the physical and chemical properties of Diastase-Stearns with other products of a similar nature on the market. Ours is perfectly sweet in smell and taste, and possesses a starch-digesting power above that of any other diastase on the market, animal or vegetable.

In this connection it is of interest to note the statement made in a recent paper of Dr. H. W. Wiley (Chief of the Division of Chemistry, U. S. Dept. of Agriculture,) and W. H. Krug, read before the American Chemical Society, and published in the April Journal of that organization. The paper treats of the "Estimation of Starch," and says concerning our product: "We have also tried quite extensively the pancreatic diastase prepared by Frederick Stearns & Co., Detroit, and found it exceedingly active and free of any reducing matter. The indications are that it may prove to be the most desirable form of hydrolyser yet used."

There are other sources of diastase beside the pancreas of animals. Diastase takes an important part in fitting the starch

of vegetables for vegetable food. That is, vegetables store up starch in their tissues as food for future use, and before the plant can utilize it, conversion into sugar by the action of vegetable diastase must occur. But the needs of plants in this connection are very different from the needs of animals. Plants have plenty of time to digest their food, but one meal rapidly succeeds another in animals, especially in man. On this account nature has furnished the animal body with a diastase which is many times more active than vegetable diastase. Animal diastase is, therefore, better fitted for the digestive processes in the animal body. Again, as pointed out by Chittenden, the products of digestion of starch constitute a peculiar series, and each one of the series may have an important part to play in the nutrition of the body. As the action of diastasic ferments still remains, to a great extent, an unexplored field, it is impossible to say just what part these different products play in nutrition. There are, therefore, abundant reasons why animal diastase is to be preferred to that derived from plants. The latter is fitted to take a part in raising mineral compounds to the plane of vegetable life. The former takes part in raising vegetable matter to that higher and infinitely more complex plane of existence peculiar to animals.

**40. Digitalis.** There are few drugs of greater importance to the medical profession than digitalis, which is without doubt the most extensively used cardiac tonic, and is perhaps the most reliable. It is therefore very necessary that the preparations of it should be active and uniform in strength. Our fluid extract of digitalis is not excelled in these two important requirements by any other preparation now on the market. It is made from prime, selected digitalis, and carefully adjusted by assay to a uniform standard of strength, so that each lot shall represent not only the full activity of the drug, but shall be of the same strength as every other lot of fluid extract of digitalis sent out by us. We commend it to the medical profession with the confidence which comes from a knowledge of its high therapeutic value and the satisfaction with which it has ever been used in the past. **41. Dover's Powder, Fluid Extract.** This preparation, which is often called Fluid Dover's Powder, is simply the offi-

cial Tincture of Ipecac and Opium. Each Cc. represents 1-10 gramme each of ipecac and opium, both of which are assayed before being used to make this preparation. The tincture may be used wherever Dover's Powder is indicated. For price see page 27.

**42. Duboisia.** The alkaloid of this drug, which has been called duboisine, has been found to be a mixture of hyoscyne and atropine. The properties of duboisia are very similar to those of hyoscyamus or stramonium, although it is more of a cerebral sedative than either. It is said to be of considerable value in vesical tenesmus, night-sweats of phthisis, etc. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**43. Echinacea.** The root of *Echinacea angustifolia*, more commonly known in the western United States as "Black Sampson," has been recommended as a very powerful alterative and antisiphilitic. It is also alleged to be useful in the treatment of wounds inflicted by snakes and rabid animals. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**44. Embelia.** An East Indian drug which is reputed to possess valuable tenicidal properties, and to be almost specific in rheumatic complaints. According to Worden the active principle is embelic acid, and the ammonium salt of this acid was found an effective tenifuge. The drug has not been sufficiently investigated as yet for a correct estimate of its value to be reached. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**45. Ephedra antisiphilitica.** An herb indigenous to western United States, particularly Arizona and contiguous territory. A somewhat superficial examination made by Loew did not reveal the presence of an alkaloid, but a peculiar tannin was separated. The drug enjoys a popular reputation in Arizona as a specific in venereal diseases, particularly gonorrhoea, for which it is employed in the form of a decoction. It is probably only alterative and astringent. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**46. Ergot.** Few drugs are more extensively employed than ergot, and it is therefore of great importance that preparations of it shall be of full strength. Our fluid extract is made from carefully selected latest crop ergot, and is carefully adjusted by assay, so that uniformity of strength as well

as a high degree of therapeutic activity is assured. These qualities have won an enviable reputation for our fluid extract of ergot in the past, and we shall continue to keep it up to its present high standard of excellence. For price see page 21.

**47. Eschscholtzia Californica.** This plant, native to California and known as "California Poppy," is alleged to be a harmless calmative, analgesic and soporific. In addition, it is said to be free from certain effects which accompany the use of opium, such as constipation and derangement of digestion. It is one of the Papaveraceæ, and was claimed by Bardet and Adrian to contain morphine. This, however, failed of confirmation by König and Tietz, who could not find morphine in specimens of the plant cultivated at Marburg. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**48. Euphorbia.** A tropical plant, said by Dujardin-Beaumetz and other clinicians to give excellent results in the treatment of asthma and asthmatic bronchitis, also in chronic and subacute bronchitis, as well as other affections of the respiration. For price of fluid extract see page 21.

**49. Fluid Extracts, Assayed.** Properly speaking, an assayed fluid extract is one which has been submitted to appropriate tests and made to conform to a certain standard. In the cases of those drugs for which the pharmacopœia specifies standards the official requirements are taken as the criterion, but the number so treated by the pharmacopœia is insignificant when compared with the total number—more than five hundred—listed by us. Therefore we have adopted arbitrary standards in the other cases and in this we have been guided by our experience of many years in this line, so that our requirements for these are such as to make the finished product in every case represent not an average but a *prime* drug of the market.

It is true that comparatively a small proportion of the drugs known to modern pharmaceutical science may be assayed for alkaloids, but in the cases of non-alkaloidal drugs we assay for glucosides, resins, oleoresins, etc., depending on the nature of the drug, i. e., what its active principle may be. In still other cases, and these of course are numerous, we are compelled to resort to a standard for dry extractive, inasmuch as scientific

investigation has not yet disclosed more accurate means of valuation. Some few drugs also may be more accurately standardized by physiological tests; conspicuous among these is aconite.

Our methods of assay are of course varied to meet the requirements of individual drugs. For alkaloids we employ principally volumetric methods of estimation, but in some cases gravimetric; of the volumetric methods we resort to titration with standard acids in some cases, while in others we find titration by Mayer's reagent to be more satisfactory.

It will be seen then, that our fluid extracts (and the same applies to our extracts) may be relied on to represent the drugs they are made from, truly and exactly. There is no haphazard, no guesswork about our methods: beginning with an assayed drug, assaying the unfinished product and finally assaying the finished preparation we obtain a fluid extract which is a model of pharmaceutical skill.

**50. Fluids.** Among the numerous other new pharmaceutical preparations that we have from time to time introduced are the fluids (listed among, but not necessarily fluid extracts,) which represent concentrated forms of various official and unofficial preparations, such as tinctures, syrups, elixirs and wines. These are carefully prepared, and on being diluted according to directions on the label furnish elegant and permanent preparations equal in all respects to those obtained by following the official processes. We have sometimes called these preparations "Druggists' Conveniences," and we feel sure that the thousands who have used them will agree with us that they are conveniences—and necessities as well. Since our successful introduction of this line of preparations, other houses have followed our example and offer similar goods to the trade. We do not believe, however, that any other house in the United States offers so complete a line of them. Nearly every compound tincture and compound syrup of the U. S. and British Pharmacopœias, most of the important elixirs, tinctures and syrups of the Eclectic Dispensatory and National Formulary, and many other unofficial but widely used preparations may be prepared from these fluids by simply diluting with the proper menstruum, be that alcohol, elixir, syrup or wine.

In addition to this line of preparations, several other compound fluids are offered which are intended for medicinal use

without further manipulation. In most cases they are not true fluid extracts, but for the sake of convenience are listed along with them.

**51. Fluids, Half-Strength.** We list quite a number of preparations among our fluid extracts for the sake of convenience, which are not true fluid extracts. Our fluids to which reference is made under note No. 50 are examples of this, also some tinctures which are given among the fluid extracts, and in addition thereto a class of preparations known generally as half-strength fluids. As is well known to most pharmacists, it is impossible to make permanent, true fluid extracts of certain drugs consisting largely or wholly of resins, gum-resins, etc. But there is a demand for concentrated liquid preparations of such drugs and this demand we supply with our "half-strength" or "semi-normal" fluids. In most cases these are just one-half the strength of true fluid extracts, i. e. each Cc. of the fluid represents one-half gramme of the drug. Among these may be mentioned aloes, asafetida, benzoin, catechu, myrrh, and tolu. Besides these we prepare a Fluid Guaiaac resin, of 60 per cent. strength, and a Concentrated Opium for tincture, of 40 per cent. strength. These fluids are very convenient for the druggist's use in making up tinctures, etc., and will be found to answer the purpose completely.

**52. Gelsemium.** Several years ago we dropped from our list the fluid extract of the green root, as clinical investigations had failed to demonstrate that there was any advantage possessed by it over that of the dried drug. In fact, most of the testimony is to the effect that the fluid extract of the green drug is less reliable than the other. Our fluid extract of gelsemium is assayed carefully several times during its process of manufacture and each lot is made to conform to the same standard, viz., .5 per cent. gelsemine. This insures uniformity of strength and a high standard of activity. For price see page 23.

**54. Golden Seal, Colorless.** This preparation, which has been on the market for a number of years, owes most of its medicinal value to the white alkaloid of hydrastis which it contains. It is largely used as an injection or wash in inflamed

conditions of the mucous membranes, and being colorless does not stain the clothing. For price see page 24.

**55. Golden Seal, Non-alcoholic.** To meet the demand for a fluid aqueous preparation of golden-seal we placed this on the market several years ago. It contains both the white and yellow alkaloids of golden-seal together with the other principles of the root. It is miscible with both aqueous and alcoholic liquids without precipitation and is an elegant and efficient preparation of the drug. For price see page 24.

**56. Guaco.** In Mexico, and Central and South America, guaco is considerably employed as a febrifuge and anthelmintic, and is also alleged to be of considerable value in rheumatic affections, epidemic cholera and chronic diarrhea. For price of fluid extract see page 24.

**57. Guarana.** We have adopted a standard of 4% caffeine for the fluid extract of this drug, although that is somewhat above the average yield of caffeine in the guarana commonly found in the market. On account of its comparatively large alkaloidal content, this drug has come into considerable prominence as a remedy for sick headache and for other nervous complaints in which caffeine is indicated. **58. Helonias Compound.** Although other manufacturers use the term Helonias Compound as a synonym for Mitchella Compound (Squaw Vine Compound) of the Eclectic Dispensatory, we, as introducers of the *original* Helonias Compound, retain the original name for our formula, in which helonias predominates. We list also Mitchella Compound, of the Eclectic Dispensatory, under its proper title, but desire to call special attention to the fact that the medical properties of Helonias Compound and Mitchella Compound are quite different, the latter being a parturient, emmenagogue and antispasmodic, while Helonias Compound is a genito-urinary tonic and diuretic. **59. Horse-nettle.** A perennial plant indigenous to southern United States, which has come into prominence on account of its value in epilepsy. It is also useful in idiopathic tetanus and in convulsions accompanied by albuminuria during pregnancy. Aphrodisiac properties have also been

ascribed to it. We offer fluid extracts of the root and berries. For prices see page 26.

**60. Hydriodic Acid, Concentrated Solution.** This solution is ten times as strong as the official syrup, therefore the latter may be prepared from it by adding nine parts (by weight) of simple syrup to one part of the solution. Occasionally, also, physicians wish to prescribe two or three per cent. syrup of hydriodic acid. With the concentrated solution, a syrup of the desired strength can be prepared by altering the proportions used. For price see page 156.

**61. Hydriodic Acid, Syrup of.** Our syrup of hydriodic acid conforms completely to U. S. P. requirements, and is not surpassed in permanency by any other preparation of its kind on the market. For price see page 172.

**62. Hysterionica.** An herb native to Chile, which is said to be of considerable value in flatulent dyspepsia and in inflammation of the bowels accompanied by hemorrhage. Baille considers it also a reliable remedy in gonorrhoea and other complaints involving inflammation of the genito-urinary tract. For price of fluid extract see page 26.

**63. Indian Hemp.** Four or five different drugs are more or less generally known as Indian Hemp, either with or without other descriptive titles. This often leads to confusion and might possibly cause serious results by the administration of one drug under that name when another was desired. We have, therefore, decided to restrict our use of the term Indian Hemp to the official *Cannabis Indica* from *Cannabis sativa*. *Apocynum*, sometimes called Black Indian Hemp, is listed by us under the name Canadian Hemp. *Asclepias incarnata*, sometimes called White Indian Hemp, is listed as Swamp Milkweed. Therefore, when we receive orders for fluid extract of Indian Hemp, we shall supply the U. S. P. preparation unless otherwise requested.

**Indian Hemp, Powdered Extract.** We have satisfied ourselves by experimentation that powdered extract of Indian Hemp cannot be so prepared as to represent more than *one-third* of an equivalent weight of the pilular extract. Our preparation, therefore, conforms to that standard, being an ex-

ception to the general rule that our solid and powdered extracts are of the same medicinal strength, weight for weight. For price see page 59.

**64. Jamaica Dogwood.** This drug which we introduced to the medical profession, has proven a valuable anodyne, sedative and hypnotic. The bark of the root is the part employed, it being much more active than other portions of the tree. For price of fluid extract see page 27.

**65. Jambul seed.** The remarkable property of arresting the conversion of starch into sugar is attributed to this drug, upon somewhat slender evidence it would seem, and it is said to have been used with success in diabetes, serving to diminish considerably the amount of sugar excreted. In India it is also used as a stimulant and astringent in diarrhea. For price of fluid extract see page 27.

**66. Jurubeba.** This Brazilian drug is alleged to be of value in gonorrhoea and in syphilis, but its principal use is as a deobstruent and tonic. For price of fluid extract see page 28.

**67. Kamala.** The value of this most efficient tenicide is well known. It acts particularly well in combination with male-fern, and we wish to call attention to our No. 49 soft elastic capsules of male-fern and kamala, page 154, and No. 71 extra sized soft elastic capsules of male-fern, kamala and castor oil, page 155. For price of fluid extract see page 28.

**Kasagra.** See note 24.

**68. Kava-Kava.** Has been employed with good results in the treatment of gonorrhoea, vaginitis, leucorrhoea, and in other inflamed conditions of the genito-urinary tract. For price of fluid extract see page 28.

**69. Kino, Tincture.** We formerly listed a half-strength fluid kino, for the extemporaneous preparation of the tincture, but discontinued it as we found it liable to gelatinize, causing our customers and ourselves considerable annoyance. We now offer the official tincture of kino, which is much more permanent and satisfactory than the more concentrated fluid preparations of the drug. For price see page 28.

**70. Kola.** We are the introducers of kola in America, and the chemistry of this drug which has become so important in modern materia medica, has been investigated to a greater

extent through our instrumentality than that of any other house in the United States, we might almost say, in the world. We were the original, and are yet the largest importers of the fresh, undried, true African kola into this country. We have published more scientific literature on kola than any other house and will be pleased to send to anyone who may desire it, our illustrated monograph, also reprints of scientific papers describing the recent investigations into the chemistry of this interesting drug. Kola has fully justified the claims made for it as a cerebro-spinal nerve stimulant and conservator of energy. We are in possession of a great number of clinical reports certifying to the value of our preparations of kola in nervous exhaustion, lassitude, melancholia, mental depression, cardiac weakness, vomiting in pregnancy, etc., etc., indicating that its scope as a remedial agent is wide and that it is a trustworthy remedy when employed in the form of preparations of the fresh nut, such as Kola-Stearns, which is a palatable, full strength fluid extract, or Kolavin, which is a pleasantly aromatized wine of fresh kola. We also offer Kolacyls, a delicious confection of the active medicinal principles of kola as they exist in natural combination undisturbed by the addition of other chemicals; these are designed for the use of bicyclists and athletes, being put up in very concentrated form, convenient to carry in the pocket.

Finally let it be said once for all that there is not the slightest danger of a "kola habit" being formed. Although the drug has been used very extensively in the last few years, almost indiscriminately by the laity in some cases, there is not as yet one case on record tending to show that a "kola habit" has been formed. Furthermore there is no reason whatever to suppose that such a habit would be any more deleterious than that of tea or coffee which is admittedly not of a very serious nature. See pages 28, 200, 201.

**71. Kousso.** This drug is highly valued in Abyssinia as a vermifuge, and has been proven to have extraordinary efficacy in the destruction of tapeworm. For price of fluid extract see page 28.

**71 a. Lactinated Pepsin.** Few combinations of digestive ferments have given better satisfaction than this one. It con-

tains pepsin, pancreatin, diastase, lactic acid, hydrochloric acid and milk sugar, thus representing the various digestive fluids of the body. The liquid preparations include Liquid Lactinated Pepsin, Syrup of Lactinated Pepsin with Phosphates and a number of Elixirs, all of which possess the therapeutic properties of the various amounts of Lactinated Pepsin contained in them. **72. Licorice Aromatic.** We offer three aromatic preparations of licorice, viz: the fluid extract, syrup and elixir. The fluid extract (see page 29) is itself an excellent vehicle for the administration of quinine and other bitter substances, and from it, by diluting properly, an aromatic syrup or elixir can be prepared. The syrup (see page 173) and the elixir (see page 167) offered in our list are elegant preparations capable of masking 25 grains of quinine to the fluidounce.

As the sweet principle of licorice is precipitated by acids care should be taken not to dispense acids or acid salts in combination with either of these preparations.

**73. Lily of the Valley.** In addition to the official fluid extract of the root we list also fluid extracts of the herb and flowers. This drug, whose action as a cardiac tonic is very similar to that of digitalis, is coming into extensive use and has the advantage over digitalis of having no cumulative action. All parts of the plant possess the same medical properties but the root seems to contain the largest amount of active principles. For prices of fluid extracts see pages 29, 30.

**74. Lozenges, Compressed, Weight of.** Following is given a list of those compressed lozenges which are not of the usual size (20 grains each, 350 to the pound). For price list of lozenges and troches see page 144.

**75. Male-fern.** There are but few drugs which deteriorate more rapidly than this one in the dried state and therefore many of the preparations of male-fern now on the market are quite inert and worthless. In preparing our fluid extract, the crude drug is first assayed and then the finished fluid extract is made to conform to a standard of 10 per cent. oleoresin. An active and thoroughly reliable product is thus obtained whose results will be found uniform. For price see page 31.

**76. Manaca.** This is a Brazilian plant the root of which is much employed in that country in the treatment of chronic subacute rheumatism and erysipelas. It has also been employed in this country to some extent, particularly in the treatment of rheumatic affections, with fairly satisfactory results. On account of its powerful alterative properties it has been sometimes called "vegetable mercury," but this title is more commonly understood to belong to mandrake, and to prevent confusion its use should be restricted to the latter. **77. Muirapuama.** A Brazilian drug reputed to be one of the most powerful aphrodisiacs known. Very little is known of its real value, as it has not yet received a thorough clinical investigation. For price of fluid extract see page 32.

**78. Mutisia viciaefolia.** A Bolivian drug belonging to the Compositæ which is said to be a valuable antispasmodic

**79. Newbouldia.** The root bark of *Newbouldia lævis*, native to tropical Africa, and said to be a valuable astringent in diarrhea and dysentery. For price of fluid extract see page 33.

**80. Ointments, Ground.** There are a number of ointments in general use which are extremely difficult to prepare in the usual way. Conspicuous among these are the ointments of zinc oxide, red and yellow mercuric oxides, and ammoniated mercury. Our ointments are ground with machinery especially constructed for the purpose, and are perfectly smooth and homogeneous. They therefore give perfect satisfaction and are elegant pharmaceutical preparations.

Inasmuch as we do not employ the ointment bases prescribed by the pharmacopœia, the designation "U. S. P." signifies only that the official standard of strength is adhered to. For list of ointments see page 191.

**81. Oleates.** Most oleates are true chemical combinations, and not merely solutions of the alkaloid or metal in oleic acid. Oleate of arsenic, is however, an exception to this rule, it now being considered that the oleic acid acts only as a solvent and that the arsenic exists in the "oleate" as arsenous acid.

Our oleate of mercury is permanent and will keep in any climate. This is an item of considerable importance, as mercuric oleate is usually unstable.

It has been thoroughly demonstrated that medicinal agents exhibited as oleates, or as oleic acid solutions, are much more readily absorbed by the skin than when administered in combination with the ordinary ointment bases. For list of oleates see page 189.

**82. Opium, Preparations of.** In addition to the official wine and tinctures of opium, we offer Fluid Opium, Concentrated, assayed, of two-fifths regular fluid extract strength, for the extemporaneous preparation of U. S. P. and B. P. tinctures; Fluid Opium, aqueous and deodorized, of the same strength, for preparing Tinct. Deodorized Opium, U. S. P.; Fluid Opium, camphorated (eight times the strength of "Paregoric"), for preparing Camphorated Tincture of Opium,

U. S. P.; and Liquid Camphor Compound (eight times as strong as Comp. Tinct. Camphor, B. P., which it is used to prepare). For prices see pages 33, 34.

All our preparations of opium are assayed to conform to the official requirements, and are strictly reliable.

**83. Opium, Crystal.** This is an elegant scale or "crystal" preparation of opium (freed from narcotine and the disagreeable odorous principle), and is intended for dispensing purposes. It is in fine light-brown scales, and is assayed to conform to a standard of 10 per cent. morphine, 0.25 per cent. codeine, and 0.10 per cent. narceine. Prices quoted on application.

**87. Pichi.** A terebinthinate diuretic, reputed also to possess cholagogic properties. It is employed with benefit in both acute and vesical catarrh and is recommended in the treatment of gonorrhœa and gonorrhœal prostatitis. It is said to aid in the expulsion of renal and cystic calculi, but is generally considered to be contra-indicated in organic kidney diseases. For price of fluid extract see page 35.

**88. Pills—Friability and Solubility.** That the hardness of a substance has nothing to do with its solubility is very evi-

dent, on reflection. Taking some familiar examples, such as rock salt, rock candy (crystallized sugar), fused calcium chloride, potassium hydrate, sodium hydrate, and gelatin, we find that all are very hard and may be easily driven into a pine board without fracture. And these are among the most soluble substances known, consequently their hardness does not affect their solubility, or they would be quite insoluble.

On the other hand, the mere fact that a substance can be easily reduced to a powdered form does not in any way indicate that it is soluble. Some of the most insoluble substances known, such as charcoal, silver chloride, calomel, magnesia, prepared chalk, etc., etc., are very friable. We thus have the most convincing proof that soluble substances may be very hard, and that insoluble substances may be very friable. Therefore the assertion that mass pills are insoluble because hard, and that other kinds of pills are soluble because friable, is not in accordance with the facts.

Mass pills are usually prepared by massing the medicinal constituents with an excipient. If the pills are properly made this excipient is very soluble, and is composed chiefly of sugar, gelatin, acacia, dextrin, etc., in varying combinations and proportions to suit the individual requirements of each case. The coating also is either of sugar or gelatin. Therefore all the non-medicinal ingredients are soluble, and are, furthermore, *substances whose solubility is not in the least diminished by age*, as every pharmacist well knows. There is consequently not a shadow of foundation in fact for the assertion (made for commercial purposes) that all mass pills deteriorate with age. Some mass pills may—but ours, being properly made, will not and we are prepared to prove it. Our pills begin to disintegrate soon after reaching the stomach or duodenum (depending on the kind of coating, etc.), and produce their medicinal effect. This is because they are mass pills, soluble and properly made.

Friable pills, which are coated with a thin, brittle, insoluble shell, must be pulverized before they can be digested by the stomach. The absurdity of such a scheme is very apparent, for while these pills may be crushed to a powder under the thumb, it must be remembered that the di-

gestive apparatus works, not by grinding like a drug mill, but by gentle agitation in the presence of solvent fluids. Therefore, insoluble substances which require crushing pass out of the alimentary canal with the waste products of the system. There is no more familiar example of this than the peanut, which if swallowed whole would pass through the alimentary canal intact. And yet a peanut is friable and may be easily crushed to fragments under the thumb. What is true of the peanut is true of friable pills, and if friable pills are to be administered they should be pulverized before swallowing, if any medicinal effect is to be expected.

Our contention is that mass pills, such as made in our laboratory, represent the highest development of the pill-makers' art. They are soluble, elegant, permanent, and reliable. We will be pleased to send copies of the *Pharmacologist* or *New Idea* containing Prof. Sherrard's article entitled "Friability is not Solubility," and describing the result of over 3000 tests of the solubility of the various pills of the market, to any physician or pharmacist, on application.

**89. Pills, Gelatin-coated only.** There are a number of pills whose bulk would be so materially increased by sugar-coating, that they would be inconveniently large and difficult to swallow, while gelatin-coating does not add appreciably to their size. For that reason we offer such pills in gelatin coating only.

**90. Pills, Sugar-coated only.** Gelatin coating is not suitable for such pills as undergo variations in consistency or volume by reason of changes in temperature, because they are liable to lose their shape or burst the coating in warm weather. Pills containing salts, either deliquescent or freely soluble in aqueous fluids, or ingredients which act unfavorably on the gelatin, rendering the coating insoluble, should not be gelatin-coated. For these reasons we offer pills belonging to the above named classes with sugar coating only.

**91. Podophyllin, soluble.** A soluble form of podophyllin, which, being nearly tasteless, is very satisfactory for dispensing in liquid preparations. It is incompatible with acids, metallic salts, and strongly alcoholic preparations. For price see page 176.

**92. Powdered Extracts, Assayed.** Our powdered extracts are of equivalent medicinal strength with solid extracts, except that of *Cannabis Indica*, which is only one-third that strength as mentioned in note 63.

Powdered extracts of alkaloidal drugs are submitted to assay and made to conform to the standards specified in the list. The importance of this will be readily appreciated on considering the fact that the yield of extractive matter varies widely with different samples of the same drug. See page 59.

**93. Quebracho.** This drug, although said to be employed in Chile as an antiperiodic, is used in this country in the treatment of asthmatic affections. It is a diuretic, tonic and genito-urinary vitalizer, and has a special action on the ovaries, testes, prostate, and mammary glands. **96. Senna.** Although both the Alexandria and India sennas are official, we find that the preference of both physicians and pharmacists is for the Alexandria, and unless otherwise specified on the order, the fluid extract we supply is prepared from this variety. For price see page 41.

**97. Senna pods.** These have the same properties as the leaves, but are said to be slightly more active and less apt to gripe. For price of fluid extract see page 42.

98. **Sierra Salvia**, Mountain Sage. This drug was introduced as a substitute for quinine and has a local reputation in its habitat, western United States, as an active and efficient diuretic, diaphoretic and antiperiodic. For price of fluid extract see page 42.

99. **Strophanthus**. Professor Fraser introduced this drug to the medical profession in 1870, and it is considered a most valuable cardiac tonic, acting similarly to digitalis, but being non-cumulative. **107. Solid Extracts, Assayed.** Our solid extracts which contain alkaloids, or are otherwise of determinable strength, are carefully assayed and made to conform to specified standards. Each lot of extract is therefore of uniform medicinal strength with every other lot of the same kind. ## TABLES OF INFORMATION.

## A PRACTICAL SCHEME FOR URINE ANALYSIS.

The specimen of urine for examination should be taken from the whole quantity (well mixed) passed in 24 hours—that passed, say, from 7 o'clock one morning to the same hour the following morning, and should be tested before decomposition sets in. The principal points of note are enumerated in the following :

**QUANTITY.**—The amount voided in 24 hours varies, normally, within wide limits. The normal amount is usually stated as 1500 Cc. (50 fl. ozs.).

**Increased**—By excessive ingestion of liquids, as water, beer, milk, etc.; by cold and damp weather and other conditions interrupting cutaneous transpiration; in diabetes, hysteria, in contracted kidney and waxy disease of the kidney.

**Decreased**—By ingestion of small quantity of liquids; in hot, dry weather (excessive perspiration); in diarrhea; in febrile conditions; in the earlier stages of dropsies; in certain forms of Bright's disease.

**COLOR.**—The color of normal urine is that of amber or slightly reddish-yellow. The color of urine is much affected by food and medicine, as well as by many morbid conditions. Santonin colors it a bright yellow; pyocyanin, a blue; madder, logwood, rhubarb, a red or brownish-red; strong coffee, turpentine, creosote, carbolic acid, etc., render it dark. A red or smoky color may indicate blood; greenish-yellow or brown, bile; whitish or turbid, earthy phosphates (excess), pus, or mucus.

Decreased quantity of urine is usually accompanied by increase in color, as in febrile conditions, etc., and, *vice versa*, as in diabetes, hysteria, etc.

REACTION.—Determined by the use of litmus-paper—acid turns the blue, red; and alkaline, the red, blue. The normal reaction of the urine is *slightly acid*, though at times it may be neutral. Nitrogenous food increases acidity; vegetable food decreases it. Some drugs influence the reaction of the urine, e. g., organic acids (citric, tartaric, etc.), and their salts with the alkali bases render the urine less acid. Mineral acids render the acidity greater. Alkalinity is generally due to decomposition of urea into ammonium carbonate, seen in retention, cystitis, etc. In this case, gentle heat will restore the red color of the litmus paper used.

ODOR.—Normally, characteristic, urinous. Concentration increases odor. Many foods, as asparagus, and drugs, as cubeb, turpentine, etc., greatly influence the odor. Turpentine gives the odor of violets. In diabetes mellitus, it is fragrant; in cystitis, retention, etc., with decomposition, it is fetid.

SPECIFIC GRAVITY.—Most conveniently ascertained by means of a urinometer. The urine should be at or very near the temperature at which the urinometer was graduated (generally 60° F.), and in a vessel sufficiently large to permit the instrument floating free of the sides. Read the sp. gr. from the top of the meniscus, on a level with the eye. The sp. gr. of normal urine is 1015 to 1025. In infants it is low—1007 to 1012. By multiplying the last two figures of the sp. gr. by 2.33 (Häser's coefficient) a close approximation to the number of parts, per 1,000, of solids contained may be obtained, and from this the total amount of solids passed in 24 hours may be easily calculated, which is normally 53 to 67 grammes (800 to 1,025 grains).

Increased—In diabetes mellitus; in cyanotic induration of the kidney; in acute diffuse nephritis; in concentrated urine, etc.

Decreased—In diabetes insipidus; in Bright's disease; by fasting; in copious quantity of urine, etc.

**URIC ACID**—Tests.—A roughly approximate test of the diminution or increase of uric acid in urine may be applied as follows: Place in a test-tube  $f\ 3\ ij$  of the urine to be examined and the same quantity of normal urine in another test-tube. Now acidulate each with hydrochloric acid and set aside for 24 hours. A comparison of the two sediments (uric acid) will show the relative amounts.

Increased—Excess nitrogenous food; excessive tissue waste; diminished oxidation; gout; rheumatism; general malassimilation; diseases of the liver.

Decreased—By vegetable diet; exercise; in chronic Bright's disease, etc.

**UREA**—Tests.—Place  $f\ 3\ ij$  of urine in a test-tube, add  $f\ 3\ ss$  of colorless nitric acid and set the tube in ice water. If urea is in excess, the characteristic crystals of urea nitrate will be precipitated. Increase of urea raises the sp. gr. of the urine. If the sp. gr. of the urine is lower than normal and no ppt. is obtained by the above test, evaporate  $f\ 3\ ij$  of the urine

to one-half its bulk, then apply the test as before. If no ppt. (precipitate), the urea is below normal.

If there be no abnormal ingredients present, e. g., glucose, albumin, etc., the urea present may be approximately estimated by calculating the amount of solids present, as given under specific gravity (*vide*) and dividing the result by 2.

Increased—In febrile conditions; by excess of nitrogenous foods; in diabetes; epileptic attacks; during administration of phosphorus, arsenic and alcohol.

Decreased—In diseases of the liver, acute yellow atrophy, carcinoma, etc.; in faulty excretion due to renal disorders, biliary colic, etc.

CHLORIDES.—Place in a test-tube f3ij of the urine to be examined, and in a companion tube the same quantity of normal urine. Acidulate each with nitric acid, add a solution of silver nitrate (1-50), enough to ppt. the chlorides, set aside and let settle. A comparison of the two ppts. will show variation from normal.

Increased—By abundant drinking of water; increased ingestion of common salt; immediately following the crisis of acute febrile diseases, pneumonia, etc., if favorable termination is indicated.

Decreased—In diarrhea; in rapid formation of large transudations; acute febrile conditions, especially just prior to the crisis; acute and chronic diseases of the kidneys with albuminuria; chronic diseases.

PHOSPHATES.—Put into a test-tube f3ij of the urine; make decidedly alkaline with a few drops of solution of caustic potash, boil and set aside for ppt. to settle. At the end of 20 to 25 minutes the ppt. should be about one-eighth the bulk of the urine, if the quantity is normal.

Increased—By excess of nitrogenous food; in inflammatory diseases; mental strain; traumatic menin-

gitis; acute rheumatism; rickets; extensive bone disease.

Decreased—In epilepsy; maniacal paroxysm; melancholia; general or sexual exhaustion.

NOTE.—The above simple tests are not given as yielding scientifically accurate results, but are only intended for rough approximation, which frequently will be of service to the physician in his clinical work. More elaborate and accurate tests will be found in any of the reliable works on urine analysis.

#### TESTS FOR ABNORMAL CONSTITUENTS.

**ALBUMIN.**—Place in a test-tube  $\frac{1}{2}$  of urine and heat to boiling. Add 10 or 12 drops of nitric acid. A small amount of albumin is shown by a slight diffuse cloudiness, a larger amount by a more or less flaky deposit, if considerable quantity, a firm mass will be formed.

**Heat Test.**—Filter the urine if necessary. The urine must be slightly acid; if not already so, add a drop or two of acetic acid. Now boil some in a test-tube. The presence of albumin will be indicated by an opalescence, a cloudiness, or a ppt

NOTE.—Urine containing pus or blood always contains albumin.

**Picric Acid Test.**—Picric acid has the advantage of being a test both for albumin and glucose (sugar), and its application in both is here given.

In a test-tube add equal volumes of the urine to be tested and a saturated aqueous solution of picric acid. The albumin, if present, is coagulated and is shown as a turbidity or a flaky precipitate or a heavy mass owing to its quantity.

If there is no albumin, add sufficient solution of caustic potash to make the mixture alkaline and boil. If sugar is present, the mixture will be colored a dark red or brown, or black, the color dependent on the amount of sugar present.

**GLUCOSE (SUGAR).**—**Picric Acid Test.**—See under albumin.

**Trommer's Test.**—To a small quantity of urine in a test-tube, add a small amount of solution of copper

sulphate, being careful not to get an excess of the latter; make strongly alkaline with solution of caustic potash and boil. A yellow or red ppt. indicates sugar.

Moore's Test.—Add to the urine about one-fourth its volume of caustic potash solution and apply heat. If glucose be present, the color of the mixture will become dark yellow or brown, and an odor of molasses will be evolved. Nitric acid added will more or less completely destroy the color.

BILIARY MATTERS.—Biliary coloring matters occur in the urine in different forms of icterus, and color the urine yellowish-brown, deep-brown, greenish-yellow, or nearly pure green. The foam produced by shaking the urine possesses a yellow or greenish tint.

Gmelin's Test.—Rosenbach's Modification.—Filter the urine through a very small filter. Apply to the filter, after the urine has all passed through, a drop of yellow nitric acid. A pale yellow spot will be formed, surrounded by a play of colors—red, violet, blue and green.

Pus.—The best means of detecting pus is the microscope, but Donne's pus-test may be applied. Let the urine stand in a test-tube, or, better, a conical glass, until the sediment is well settled; then carefully pour off the supernatant liquid; now add to the sediment a few drops of a strong solution of caustic potash and stir. A thick, slimy, tough mass will be formed.

BLOOD.—Guaiacum Test.—Place in a test-tube equal volumes of tinct. guaiacum and old turpentine which has been exposed to the action of the air under the influence of light for some time, and hence has absorbed oxygen. This mixture should not have the slightest blue color. Now cautiously add the urine to be tested. If blood be present, a ring will be formed at the union of the two liquids—changing from a bluish green to a blue color. Pus in the urine gives the same reaction, but can be differentiated from blood in that the former does not require the ozonized turpentine to obtain the reaction. The blue produced by pus is dissipated by heat, that by blood, not.

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 RULE FOR PROPORTIONING DOSES.

(DR. YOUNG'S).

To arrive at the proportionate dose for a person under adult age, add 12 to the age and divide the age by the result. Thus, for a child 2 years old the dose is 1-7 that of the adult dose :

$$\frac{2}{2 + 12} = \frac{1}{7}$$

Children do not tolerate narcotics well. Therefore, when administering them, only a little more than half the proportion indicated by the rule should be given. On the other hand, mild cathartics may be given in doses two or even three times the proportion.

For hypodermic injections the dose should be only two-thirds to three-fourths of that given by mouth. When administered by rectum, about five-fourths of the amount can be administered.

## OFFICIAL RULES FOR DILUTING ALCOHOL.

(U. S. PHARMACOPOEIA).

I. *By Volume*.—Designate the volume-percentage of the stronger alcohol by  $V$ , and that of the weaker alcohol by  $v$ . *Rule*: Mix  $v$  volumes of the stronger alcohol with pure water to make  $V$  volumes of product. Allow the mixture to stand until full contraction has taken place and until it has cooled; then make up any deficiency in the  $V$  volumes by adding more water. *Example*: An alcohol of 30 per cent. by volume is to be made from an alcohol of 94 per cent. by volume. Take 30 volumes of the 94 per cent. alcohol and add enough water to produce 94 volumes.

II. *By Weight*.—Designate the weight-percentage of the stronger alcohol by  $W$ , and that of the weaker by  $w$ . *Rule*: Mix  $w$  parts by weight of the strong alcohol with pure water to make  $W$  parts by weight of product. *Example*: An alcohol of 50 per cent. by weight is to be made from an alcohol of 91 per cent. by weight. Take 50 parts by weight of the 91 per cent. alcohol and add enough pure water to produce 91 parts by weight.

POISONS AND THEIR ANTIDOTES.

(*Era Dose Book*).

GROUP I.

Acids.—Acetic, Hydrochloric, Nitric, Nitro-muriatic, Sulphuric.

TREATMENT.—Give no emetic. Give at once large draughts of water, (or milk) with chalk, whiting, magnesia, or baking soda, or give strong soapsuds to neutralize acid; olive oil, white of egg beaten up with water, and later, mucilaginous drinks of flaxseed or slippery elm, are useful. Give laudanum (20 drops) if much pain.

GROUP II.

Carbolic acid, Creosote, Resorcin.

TREATMENT.—Promote vomiting with warm water containing baking soda, or cause it with mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Give white of egg beaten up

with water, or olive oil, (a cupful); stimulants, (whiskey, etc.) freely; warmth and friction to the extremities.

**GROUP III.**

Antimony, Chromium, Copper, Iodine, Mercury, Zinc, their compounds and preparations; Cantharides, Colchicum, Elaterium and Croton, Savin and Tansy oils.

**TREATMENT.**—Give white of eggs (half-dozen or more, raw) or flour mixed with water. Promote vomiting with warm water containing baking soda, or cause it with mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Give strong tea or coffee, stimulants if needed, laudanum (20 drops) if much pain; demulcent drinks of flaxseed or slippery elm.

**GROUP IV.**

Caustic Alkalies (Potash, Soda, Ammonia, etc.)

**TREATMENT.**—Promote vomiting by large draughts of warm water. Give vinegar or diluted lemon juice; olive oil, the whites of eggs, beaten up with water, gruel or demulcent drinks or flaxseed or slippery elm; laudanum (20 drops) if much pain.

**GROUP V.**

Alcohol, Benzin, Benzol, Camphor, Carbon bisulphide, Chloral, Chloroform, Ether, Hydrocyanic acid, its compounds and preparations.

**TREATMENT.**—If necessary, give emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Let patient have plenty of fresh air; maintain a horizontal position. Keep the body warm but try to rouse the patient by ammonia to nostrils, cold douche to the head, friction and mustard plasters to limbs, etc. Use artificial respiration.

**GROUP VI.**

Cannabis Indica, Opium, Coca—their alkaloids, salts and preparations.

**TREATMENT.**—Give emetic (if necessary) of mustard (a tablespoonful, stirred to a cream with water), followed by large draughts of warm water. Then strong tea or coffee. Rectal injections of tincture of capsicum. Arouse the patient, and

keep him awake and in motion. Keep up artificial respiration, even after life seems to be extinct.

## GROUP VII.

Aconite, Digitalis, Lobelia, Tobacco, Veratrum album and Veratrum viride—their alkaloids, salts and preparations.

TREATMENT.—Give emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water), followed by large draughts of warm water. Give strong tea or coffee, with powdered charcoal; stimulants (whiskey, etc.,) freely; warmth to the extremities; keep the patient in a horizontal position; use artificial respiration persistently.

## GROUP VIII.

Belladonna, Calabar Bean, Conium, Gelsemium, Hyoscyamus, Santonin, Stramonium—their alkaloids, salts and preparations.

TREATMENT.—Give emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water), followed by large draughts of warm water; give strong tea or coffee, with powdered charcoal; stimulants, (whiskey, etc.,) if necessary; rouse the patient if drowsy; heat and friction to extremities; artificial respiration.

## GROUP IX.

Cocculus Indicus, Nux Vomica—their alkaloids, salts and preparations.

TREATMENT.—Give emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water), followed by large draughts of warm water. Give powdered charcoal, iodide of starch, or tannin. To relieve spasms, let patient inhale pure chloroform, or give chloral hydrate (25 grains) or potassium bromide ( $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.).

## GROUP X.

Arsenic and its compounds, (Cobalt), Paris Green, "Rough on Rats," etc.

TREATMENT.—Promote vomiting with warm water, or cause it with mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Procure at once from the drug store, hydrated oxide of iron, and give a cupful of it (or mix a teaspoonful of calcined magnesia with a cup of water, add three tablespoonfuls of tincture of iron, mix well and give the whole of it). Follow with olive

oil, or white of eggs (raw) and mucilaginous drinks. Laudanum (20 drops) if much pain.

## GROUP XI.

Oxalic acid and its soluble salts.

TREATMENT.—Give chalk or whiting (tablespoonful), or even air-slacked lime (a teaspoonful in fine powder) mixed with two tablespoonfuls of vinegar. (Do *not* give soda or potash to neutralize the acid). Promote vomiting by large draughts of water, or cause it with mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Give olive oil and mucilaginous drinks; stimulants, (whiskey, etc.,) and warmth to extremities.

## GROUP XII.

Barium and its salts, Lead and its salts.

TREATMENT.—Give Epsom salt ( $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.) or Glauber's salt (one oz.) dissolved in a tumbler of water. Promote vomiting by warm water, or cause it with mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water). Give milk, demulcent drinks of flaxseed or slippery elm, and laudanum (20 drops) if much pain.

## GROUP XIII.

Silver nitrate. (Lunar Caustic).

TREATMENT.—Give common salt (a tablespoonful dissolved in a tumblerful of warm water); then an emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water) followed by large draughts of warm water. Later, give gruel, arrowroot, or demulcent drinks of flaxseed or slippery elm.

## GROUP XIV.

Phosphorus Compounds (Rat Paste, etc.)

TREATMENT.—Give an emetic of mustard (a tablespoonful stirred to a cream with water), or better, of blue vitriol, 3 grains every five minutes, until vomiting occurs. Give a teaspoonful of old thick oil of turpentine; also Epsom salt ( $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. in a tumblerful of water). Do *not* give oil, except the turpentine.


