Introductory Preface.

This Catalogue has been prepared in accordance with the following resolution passed April 2d, 1870, by the Faculty of the Medical Department of the University of Louisiana:

“Resolved unanimously, that Professor Stanford E. Chaillé be requested to prepare a new edition of his Historical Sketch of the Med'l Depart. Univ. La., together with a general catalogue of the graduates of the institution, and that the Faculty pay all the necessary expense of correspondence and publication.”

Since the above date, circulars, soliciting the information recorded, have been mailed to every Alumnus whose address could be discovered, and other means have been resorted to to render the record accurate. The general result is as follows, viz:

Thus some information is recorded as to about two-thirds of the Graduates. It is believed that of the 451 Alumni (to 1862) of whom no information has been received, not less than 200 are dead.

The information reported from different sources has, in a number of cases, been contradictory, therefore in a few instances errors may be recorded. Errors however which could prove mischievous only as to deaths, which the catalogue therefore records as *reported*, and does not officially assert their occurrence.

Great care has been taken as to the orthography of every name, and yet there are no doubt some errors; for, some of the official records prior to 1862 have disappeared, and even where these are complete, there are instances where the same student has written his own name in even three different places, so illegibly and carelessly, that no one can possibly decipher each letter with positive accuracy. These facts are stated not only to solicit corrections, but also to secure from alumni greater care in future reports. For, other editions of this catalogue will doubtless be published, and to accomplish this purpose special attention is called to the following notice which is re-published from the last Annual Circular, 1870-1.

“The Faculty takes this opportunity of calling the attention of its friends to the fact, that it desires to obtain the information requisite to publish a more complete catalogue of all its Graduates. A favor will therefore be conferred by those who will give notification of the present Post Office addresses, or of the deaths, with the date, place, and cause thereof, of any of the alumni of this institution.

“The additional information desired as to every Graduate is—the name in full (*i. e.*, without initial or any abbreviation); the place and year of birth; the place of residence, since what year there, and any contemplated change of residence; the present occupation, if not in the practice of medicine; any degrees conferred, when and by what institution; what literary or other contributions to science; the rank and service, whether officer or private, in the army; and any public office held, and honors received.

Thanks are due to Dr. Wm. P. Riddell, class of 1856, for valuable historical publications—long since out of date—of this Faculty; and to Drs. Wm. H. Watkins, class of 1868, and Geo. N. Monette, class of 1871, for material aid rendered by them in the compilation of the catalogue. Many of the alumni merit the special thanks of the Faculty for the practical interest taken by them in this enterprise.

Historical Sketch.

The first degree of Doctor in Medicine, conferred in America, was by the College of N. York in 1770. The same degree was conferred in 1771 by the institution now known as the "Med'l. Depart. of the University of Penn." in Philadelphia; where was organized, as early as 1762, and for the first time in North America, a regular system of medical education. These two were the only medical colleges prior to the Revolution. After this period, and prior to 1821, similar institutions were founded in the more northern States.

In 1821, at Lexington, Ky. was organized the first medical college in the States south of the Potomac and Ohio rivers. Next followed the "Medical College of S. Carolina" at Charleston, which chartered in 1823, gave its first course during the session of 1824-5. The "Medical College of Ga." originated in 1832. The next, and fourth in this historical sequence was the "Medical College of La.," now the "Med'l Depart. of the Univ. of La.," which is therefore the oldest medical institution in the South-West.

In September, 1834, the Medical College of Louisiana was organized in N. Orleans by the private enterprise of seven resident physicians. The prospectus of that year announced that the session would begin on the first Monday in January, 1835, and would terminate four months thereafter. The founders of the College, who constituted its first Faculty, were

- Dr. Thomas Hunt, Professor of Anatomy and Physiology;
- Dr. John Harrison, Adjunct [Demonstrations in Anatomy by];
- Dr. Chas. A. Luzenberg, Professor of Surgery;
- Dr. J. Munro Mackie, Professor of Practice;
- Dr. Thos. R. Ingalls, Professor of Chemistry;
- Dr. Aug. H. Cenas, Professor of Midwifery;
- Dr. Edwin Bathurst Smith, Professor of Materia Medica.

Dr. Ed. H. Barton, Professor of Materia Medica was substituted for Dr. E. H. Smith who withdrew from the Faculty before the first session began.

Dr. Warren Stone, during the first session discharged the duties of Dr. John Harrison, disabled by indisposition, and has been associated with this institution uninterruptedly from its first session to the present day. He was not, however, appointed to a Professorship until January 28th, 1837, and therefore is ranked in seniority, as to the present Faculty, by Prof. James Jones appointed March 2d, 1836. (See List No. 2 for additional information as to Professors.)

Professor Thos. Hunt, the Dean, delivered the first introductory lecture in the presence of the friends of the undertaking, and some eight medical students. In the circular issued at the close of the session, it was deemed a cause of congratulation, that *eleven* students had matriculated during the course.

A charter was granted to the Medical College by the Legislature, on April 2d, 1835, "and in March, 1836, the first degrees in science ever conferred in Louisiana, were conferred by the Professors of the unendowed Medical College. This remarkable epoch in the scientific history of the State was succeeded by seven years of unrequited and unaided professional labors by the Faculty, for the advancement of medical science." On October 20th, 1838, the Faculty established a School of Pharmacy for conferring the degree of "Master of Pharmacy".

In 1843, the Legislature passed a bill granting a *lease* of a lot for ten years on the following conditions: 1st. That "the Faculty of the College should discharge the duties of Attending Physicians and of Surgeons to the Charity Hospital, for the term of *ten years, without compensation.*" [This condition was complied with, thereby saving the State \$24,000, since it had, prior to this time, paid \$2400 per annum for this service.] 2d. That the Faculty should "receive as students, without fee or charge of any kind for their professional services, one indigent person from each Parish in the State," etc. [Under this condition, and to the present time, about two hundred students have been educated, at a cost for their education and diploma of \$280 each, making a sum total of \$56,000.] 3d. "That the building erected on the

lot should become the property of the State at the expiration of the said term of ten years." [This building was erected by the Faculty, and when it became the property of the State, its estimated value was \$15,000.] The edifice erected is at the corner of Common and Dryades (then Philippa) Sts., and is now designated the Law Department of the University of Louisiana, and in it the lectures of the Medical College were delivered during the four sessions from 1843-4 to 1847-8.

From the first session, the clinical lectures have been annually delivered in the Charity Hospital, where the Amphitheatre, now used, was erected in 1844, at the conjoint expense (\$5000) of the Faculty and the Administrators of the Charity Hospital.

In 1834, Governor Roman granted for the use of the Faculty, during its first session, a large room in the State House. The second course of Didactic Lectures was delivered at No. 41 Royal street; the succeeding four courses at the Charity Hospital, excepting the chemical lectures (probably at No. 14 St. Charles st.) the three next courses 1840-1843 at 239 Canal st., and the four courses (10th, 11th, 12th, 13th) from Oct. 1843 to 1847, were delivered, as above stated, in the building erected by the Faculty in 1843, and now the Law Department of the University.

In 1847, a lot adjacent to this building, 150 front on Common St. by 200 feet deep between Dryades and Baronne Sts., was appropriated by the Legislature, and \$40,000 to erect upon it a suitable building for the Medical Department. This, the central one of the three University Buildings (containing three large lecture rooms and an extensive museum) has been occupied by the Faculty from the 14th session, 1847-8, to the present time. On March 20th, 1861, the Legislature transferred from the Academic to the Medical Department, the third one of the University Buildings, designated as the East Wing, at the corner of Common and Baronne streets. Since 1865 a cross wing has been erected, which unites the East Wing with the Central Building, and thus two imposing and commodious edifices are devoted to the Medical Department, which finds in them the most ample accommodation for all of the many requisites necessary for medical education. These two buildings, with the Amphitheatre of the Charity Hospital, and its Wards containing a daily average

of about 800 patients, will continue to furnish in the future, as at present, accommodations for as large a class of medical students, and as many conveniences for their instruction as any similar institution in this country.

The conditional aid first furnished by the State in 1843 has been stated. The next public recognition of the services of the Faculty was by the Convention which framed the Constitution of 1845, which directed that "An University shall be established in the City of N. Orleans," * * * "shall be called the University of Louisiana, and the "Medical College of La." as at present organized, shall constitute the faculty of medicine."

This provision was not carried into execution until 1847, when the first Legislature elected under the Constitution of 1845, was in session, and passed the Act No. 49, February 16th, 1847, which legally transformed the "Medical College of Louisiana" into the "Medical Department of the University of Louisiana," and provided for its government.

The Constitutions of 1852, 1864, and 1868 contain articles similar to those of that of 1845, providing for the organization and maintenance of the University of La., with a Medical and other Departments.

In addition to the aid furnished by the State, which has been referred to, \$25,000 was given in 1850, and \$6000 more in 1853, to furnish the Med'l Dept. with a Museum, and such chemical and other apparatus, etc., as are needed for medical instruction. Other appropriations have been made from time to time for repairs and improvements of the University Buildings, the property of the State, but none for any other purposes whatever.

On the other hand, the *pecuniary* benefits conferred upon, and the value of the property transferred to the State, by the Faculty of the Medical Department, may be fairly estimated as follows:

Attendance, by contract, upon the Charity Hospital for ten years, \$24,000; amphitheatre in the same Hospital, \$2,500; West Wing of the University Buildings, \$15,000; library, apparatus, preparations in the museum, etc., \$25,000; repairs, insurance, etc., on the property of the State, \$25,000; education of indigent students, \$56,000 — amounting in all to \$147,500.

“ Besides these contributions to the cause of medical education, and to the establishment and advancement of the Medical Department of the University of Louisiana, the Faculty have matriculated five thousand three hundred and twenty one students in the State Medical College. Each student expends annually (at a very moderate calculation), in board, lodging, books, clothes, etc., \$500. Multiply 5321 by \$500, the expenses of each, and the result is the sum of \$2,660,000, which have been introduced into and remained as part of the wealth of the State, through the agency of the Medical Department alone.” Even under present unfavorable circumstances, this Department now attracts to the City of N. Orleans more than one hundred thousand dollars annually.

Although more than one-half of the Alumni of this Institution have been graduated in the last ten sessions (*i. e.* since 1858), they have supplied not less than seventeen professors to various medical institutions, and a much larger number of public instructors. One third of its own corps of teachers has been supplied by its graduates. About one-third of the practising physicians of N. Orleans, and a large proportion of the profession in Louisiana, Mississippi, Texas and Alabama, are graduates of this institution. From these States as a centre, the residences of the alumni radiate as far as Connecticut to the North East, and California to the North West. Every where they have established reputations for themselves, thus sustaining and augmenting that of their Alma Mater. Among its Alumni are to be found State Senators and Representatives, Mayors, Sheriffs, Justices of the Peace, Superintendents of Asylums, Hospital Surgeons, City Physicians, and many other officers filling posts of honor and profit.

They appear to have taken part in the war in very large numbers. Of the 1084 alumni to 1862, there are 451 of whom no information has been received, and it is believed that in addition to this number not less than 150 were dead prior to 1862; thus leaving a remainder of less than 450, as to whom it is reported, that more than 240 were in service during the war, and over 170 of these as medical officers.

Fortunate victors, in even a fratricidal strife, engrave on rolls

of honor and perpetuate on monumental marble the names of those who have sacrificed their lives for the triumphant cause; — the vanquished are permitted to sadly point to the graves of those who died for them, and a profession devoted to human suffering may well be pardoned when it pauses—neither to glorify the living, nor to resuscitate a lost cause, but—to number and to mourn for brothers dead on the field of battle.

Dr. Alfred S. Pickering, Class of 1853, Major of the 20th Ala. Regt. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle at Port Gibson, Miss., in 1863.

Dr. W. W. Brown, Class of 1854, died at Richmond, Va., 1864, of wounds received in battle.

Dr. C. W. Humphreys, Class of 1854, was killed in battle, at Clinton, La.

Dr. Barry Yelverton Egan, Class of 1856, Surgeon 14th. La. Regt. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle at Sharpsburg, 1862, whilst dressing a wounded soldier on the field.

Dr. Joseph B. W. Penrose, Class of 1856, Capt. 14th. La. Regt. P. A. C. S., was killed in the battles around Petersburg, 1865.

Dr. John Sims, Class of 1857, Col. 21st Miss. Regt. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle at Cedar Creek, Oct. 19th, 1864.

Dr. Jarvis M. McCary, Class of 1858, died of wounds received in battle at Atlanta, Ga., July 22d, 1864; Leg amputated; Pyæmia.

Dr. John Taylor, Class of 1858, was killed in the battle of Second Manassas.

Dr. Danl. H. McEacham, Class of 1859, Asst. Surgeon, P. A. C. S., was killed in the battle at Chickamauga, 1863.

Dr. Augustus H. Moore, Class of 1859, was killed at the battle of "Seven Pines."

Dr. Francis M. Taylor, Class of 1859, Asst. Surgeon, 6th. La. Regt. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle at Chancellorsville, Va., May 1863.

Dr. James Harper, Class of 1860, 1st Lieut. Churchill's Regt. Mounted Infy. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle of Oak Hills, Mo., 1861.

- Dr. Jefferson J. Little, Class of 1860, died of wounds received at the battle of Shiloh, 1862.
- Dr. Wm. C. Murphy, Class of 1860, Capt. "Beauregard Rifles," Wilcox's Brig. P. A. C. S., was shot through the brain at the battle of Chancellorsville, 1863.
- Dr. Jas. W. Wright, Class of 1860, Private 2d Regt. La. Vols., P. A. C. S., was killed near Richmond, Va., 1862.
- Dr. Wade Allen, Class of 1861, Lieut. P. A. C. S., was wounded in battle, captured, sent to Camp Chase, thence to Fort Delaware, where he died of Scurvy, in 1864.
- Dr. Leander Murry Graves, Class of 1861, Capt. P. A. C. S., was killed in battle at Vicksburg, Miss., May 23d, 1863.
- Dr. Geo. L. Witherington, Class of 1861, died in 1862 in a U. S. Prison.

Doctors Jas. E. Sutton, Danl. F. McInnis, Francis Whicher, Chas. M. Dougherty (Valedictorian of the Class of 1858), Robert A. Felton, Virgil V. Madden, John J. Oatis, Harry Percy, Miles W. Goldsby, Saml. Parker, Laurence Manning Austin, Walter L. Bridges, Wm. V. Harris, Jefferson H. De Votie, Nathaniel B. Moss, were all killed or "died in service." Drs. Henry Snow, Achilles P. Sparkman, Wm. J. Finch, Paul Lawrence, Jas. D. Harrell and many others live, but maimed and permanently disabled by wounds received in battle.

This long, sad list of the ravages of the war among the alumni of this institution would doubtless be more than doubled if full reports had been received from the Graduates to 1862; instead of only 270 replies from the 1084 alumni.

The information received even as to the graduates subsequent to 1865 is extremely imperfect. The last class, that of 1871, is the only one from which the record has been obtained directly, and therefore nearly complete. The following facts may prove of some interest as to 64 M. D.'s of this class; for of the total 69, five were absent and have not yet reported. Of these 64, the average age was 26 yrs.; the oldest graduate was 45 years of age, 4 were from 35-40 yrs., 5 from 30-35, 30 from 25-30, and 24 from 20-25 years of age. Of the 64, there were three who were neither natives nor residents of the Southern States during the war; there were twenty-two who were under 17 years of age in 1865;

and yet there were thirty-nine who had served as Captains, Lieutenants, or Privates in the Provisional Army of the Confederate States.

In 1854, seven years prior to the war, there were in N. Orleans less than two hundred medical students, and these were all which were in the cities on the Mexican Gulf. In 1861 there were seven hundred medical students in Mobile (Mobile Med'l Col.) and N. Orleans (Medl. Depart. Univ. La. and N. O. School of Med., which opened Nov. 1856, and closed Apl. 1870). Four hundred and four matriculates of these seven hundred were in the Medl. Depart. Univ. La. Thus in the twenty-seven years, from 1834 to 1861, this institution had augmented its class from eleven students to a number which elevated it to the third in numerical rank among the Medical Colleges of the U. S.

This result was in large part due to the learning, marked capacity, and wide-spread reputation of those members of the Faculty, who from the foundation of the College gave their zealous labor for many consecutive years to its prosperity. It is rare indeed to find a faculty consisting of men of so much ability, and permitted to prosecute their duties conjointly and uninterruptedly for so long a series of years as was given to that Faculty which consisted of

May these two be long spared to enjoy the fruits of their well spent lives, and to witness the ranks of their classes restored to numbers as large, as their own labors had so greatly aided to augment them to, prior to the war!

The war closed the doors of the Medical Department for the three years, 1863-4-5. It was then determined to permit none to

matriculate except "bona fide students," so that the published class lists since 1865, should be considerably augmented in number for fair comparison with most other institutions, as will be clearly evident from an examination of the Annual Catalogues of the different Med'l. Colleges, as to the number of M. D. matriculates. The annual classes since the war, estimated comparatively as above, have averaged not less than two hundred and fifty. This number, though much less than prior to 1862, nevertheless indicates that the popularity of this College continues to be superior to that of any other institution in the South-West. Its success has varied, but only with the prosperity of this section of the country. So soon as martial, political, and financial disasters have been fairly recovered from, and the South has once more fully entered upon the race of progressive prosperity, the number of matriculates will show annually an augmentation *pari passu* with the country's progress.

No city offers greater hospital privileges, none greater facilities for dissection than N. Orleans. These advantages, the most important and indispensable to enable the student to become *really* a physician, when properly used by teachers competent and possessed of adequate means of instruction, will always secure to the Medical Department of the University of Louisiana, the liberal patronage of students of medicine.

When the financial prosperity of Louisiana has been restored, appropriations now needed will no doubt be made which will enhance the pecuniary value of the State University,—add many things needed by the progress of our science for a more perfect system of medical education,—augment the prosperity of the City and State, by attracting to it students in larger number,—and justify Louisiana in a just claim that she not only pioneered the way to medical education in the South-West, but also prosecuted her design to such perfection as may render the final accomplishment worthy of an enlightened State, unsurpassable by any rivals.

It is the duty of the Faculty of the Medical Department to merit the fostering aid of the State, and to sustain the pride felt in this institution by every enlightened citizen. Thus far its good repute has been second to that of no medical college in this coun-

try, and its Faculty has maintained an enviable position in the estimation of the profession and public at large, and of a better judge, other Medical Faculties throughout the United States. May it ever be composed of Professors whose reputations shall have been obtained by merit, sustained by honorable labor, and directed to a nobler end than self-interest alone!
