The Sanitary Commission take this method, in addition to the means already used, to remind you of the fact that there are various supplies in the hands of the Commission to be applied to the benefit of the sick or wounded soldiers of the several regiments. These supplies are intended to meet any needs which Government does not fully provide for; they are furnished gratuitously, upon the statement of the Surgeons of the Regiments that such needs exist. The articles which are distributed are blankets, bed quilts, various flannel and cotton garments, woolen socks, towels, dressing gowns, pillows, sheets, bed sacks, jellies, dried fruit, &c., &c.

If the sick in your Regiment require any of these articles, you are earnestly requested not to fail to make a requisition upon the Commission—244 F street, Washington, D. C.
