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

Circular of Information



TO APPLICANTS

A PERSONAL interview is always desirable; if, owing to distance, this is impossible, the applicant should write to the Superintendent of the Training School, who will then forward an application blank. The blank when filled out, should be returned, with a clergymen's letter, and a physician's certificate of sound health. This constitutes a formal application.

Applicant should state in her letter her reasons and motives for entering this profession.

Accepted candidates when coming to the Training School, should be provided with the following articles:

Two or three gingham or print dresses, plainly made; six or eight white aprons made of bleached cotton, two yards wide, length to reach bottom of dress before laundered. Two bags for soiled clothing. A good supply of

plain underclothing. *Every article must be plainly marked in indelible ink with owner's full name.*

A watch with second hand, and a napkin ring. If the teeth are out of order in any way, they must receive attention before coming for the probationary months.

Candidates should remember that they come on trial; their acceptance as *pupils* will depend wholly upon the developments of the trial term.

The decision when rendered is final. The reasons for the rejection of a probationer *are not* given, and personal letters are not returned.

When called, they are expected to respond promptly, and to bring with them the means of returning to their homes, should they not successfully pass the probationary term.
