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

RULES.

The terms of the School begin on the 1st of April and the 1st of October, the course of instruction embracing a period of two years.

Candidates for admission must be women between twenty-five and thirty-five years, and possess a good common school education; they must produce certificates of good character, sound health, with mental and physical capacity for the duties of Nurses satisfactory to the Training School Committee.

If admitted they will be expected to serve two months on probation, during which time they will receive board, lodging and laundry work. Should this probationary period prove satisfactory they will then wear the School uniform, receive their monthly allowance and become Pupil Nurses, though they will not be formally enrolled until the expiration of six months, thus allowing a longer period for the study of their adaptability to the work.

During the first month's probation the applicant must be prepared for an examination in reading, penmanship, simple arithmetic and English dictation, to test her ability to read aloud well, to keep simple accounts, to write legibly and accurately reports of her patients, and to take notes of lectures. This amount of education is indispensable for a Pupil, but applicants are reminded that women of superior education and cultivation, when equally qualified for nurses, are preferred to those who do not possess these advantages. When formally enrolled as Junior Nurses they must sign an agreement to remain in the School and subject themselves to the rules and discipline of the School and Hospital for a period of two years from the time of their admission on probation, serving respectively as Juniors, Seniors and Head Nurses, providing satisfactory progress has been made in every case or promotion, which will be determined by the Principal under the direction of the Training School Committee.

Nurses will reside at the Hospital and will receive a monthly allowance of \$6.00 for the first ten months and \$8.00 for the remainder of the term. A vacation of two weeks in each year will be allowed.

In illness, all pupils will have gratuitous care, but when off duty on account of illness or necessary leave of absence the allowance will be discontinued, and time so lost must be made up at the end of term.

While on duty Nurses must wear the uniform of the School.

Outside private nursing will be required of them when their services are not needed in the Hospital.

The Training School Committee may terminate the connection of any pupil with the School for any cause or reason that may be deemed sufficient by them.

TRAINING.

The instruction includes :—

1. The dressing of blisters, burns, and wounds; the preparation and application of fomentations, cups, poultices and minor dressings.
2. Administration of enemata and douches, and the use of the catheter.
3. Methods of applying friction.
4. Management of helpless patients; moving, changing, giving baths in bed; preventing bed sores, and managing position.
5. Bandaging, making bandages and rollers, and lining splints.
6. Making beds, and changing sheets while patient is in bed.
7. Urinary analysis.
8. Ventilation.
9. Observation and record of temperature, pulse, respiration and keeping charts and bedside notes.
10. The preparing, cooking and serving of delicacies for the sick.

The instructions will be given by the attending Physicians, Surgeons, the Principal and the Head Nurses. Lectures and lessons will be given on such subjects as Hygienic Nursing, Anatomy, Physiology, Diseases, Surgery, Materia Medica, Obstetrics, Chemistry of Cooking, Antisepsis, etc., etc. Examinations will be held at stated periods.

When the full term of two years is completed there will be a final examination of the graduating class, conducted by the Examining Committee, and it being creditably passed shall entitle the members of the Class to a Diploma under the Seal of the Hospital.

All Nurses entitled to a Diploma, and having furnished further evidence of morality, capability and trustworthiness at the termination of their services in the Hospital, will be given a badge when they go out. The Training School Committee reserve the right to recall the badge from any graduate who in their opinion shall in any way, or at any time, bring discredit upon herself, the profession or the School.
