

CIRCULAR.

OFFICE OF ASSISTANT MEDICAL DIRECTOR,  
LOUISVILLE, KY., August 5th, 1862.

The attention of Medical officers is called to that portion of paragraph 35, Medical Regulations, which requires from them, *monthly to the Medical Director and quarterly to the Surgeon General, a report of sick and wounded, and of deaths, and of certificates for discharge for disability.*

Also to the Circular issued from Surgeon General's Office, May 5th, 1862, requiring *semi-annual returns* of property to the *Chief Medical Director* and to the *Surgeon General*. These returns are to be made on the 30th day of June and 31st of December. } ✓

The Medical Director is required to report to the Surgeon General all Medical officers neglecting to make these reports. Such officers will be reported by the Surgeon General to the President for dismissal from the service of the United States, unless they can offer a satisfactory explanation.

The attention of Medical Officers is called to the fact that a copy of the Medical Department which is being prepared for the Medical Director and sent to the Surgeon General as part of his report and of the report of the Surgeon General for the year 1902.
