
Mr. James introduced the following bill:

A BILL

To establish a marine hospital at the port of New York.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and is hereby, author-
- 4 ized and directed to establish a marine hospital at the port of
- 5 New York, and is authorized to procure a suitable site, with or
- 6 without buildings thereon, by purchase or condemnation by
- 7 purchase, with buildings and other improvements thereon, the
- 8 property known as the Seaman's Retreat, upon Staten Island,
- 9 New York, now leased and occupied by the United States as
- 10 a marine hospital: Provided, That the cost of the same shall

not exceed the sum of two hundred thousand dollars, which 11 12 sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby ap-13 propriated for this purpose out of any money in the Treas-14 ury not otherwise appropriated: And provided further, That 15 no part of said sum shall be expended until a valid title to said property shall be vested in the United States, nor until 16 17 the State of New York shall cede to the United States exclu-18 sive jurisdiction over the same, during the time the United 19 States shall be or remain the owner thereof, for all purposes 20 except the administration of the criminal laws of said State 21 and the service of civil process therein. 1 Sec. 2. That when the title to the property so-purchased 2 or-condemned shall have been approved by the Attorney-3 General, the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized to-erect-thereon-marine-hospital-buildings, under plans to be 4 prepared by the Supervising Architect and approved by the 5 6 Supervising Surgeon General, or, in case of the purchase of a 7 site with buildings already erected thereon, to make such alterations or repairs as, in the opinion of the Supervising 8 9 Surgeon-General, are necessary to adapt the buildings for the 10 purposes of the Marine Hospital Service. Sec. 3. That the sum-of-two-hundred and-fifty-thousand 1 2 dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby 3 appropriated for the purposes of this act, out of any money in 4 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.
